



“FIRST IN THE WEST” NEVADA REPUBLICAN CAUCUS **FAQs**

What is the Nevada GOP Caucus?

This is the recognized process for Nevada Republican voters to vote for their choice for the Republican presidential candidate.

Why a caucus?

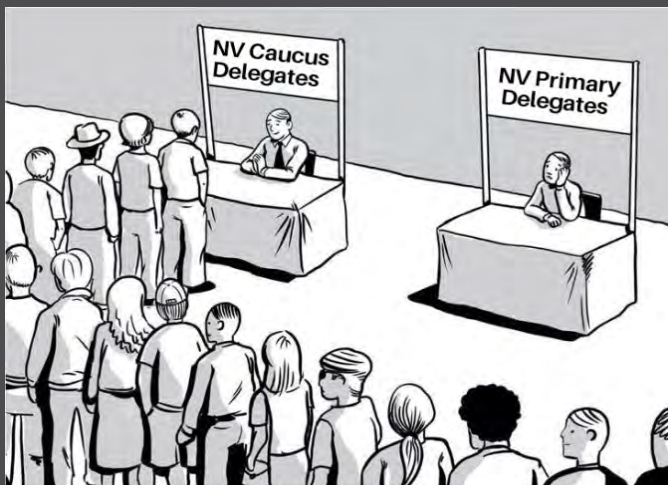
Caucuses have historically been the most frequently used technique for choosing a presidential candidate in Nevada.

When are the caucuses?

The Republican caucuses will be held Thursday, February 8, 2024, beginning at 5 PM.

Who can vote in the Nevada GOP Caucus?

To vote in the caucus you must be a registered Nevada Republican at least 30 days prior to February 8, 2024 (no later than January 8, 2024).



Can I participate in the caucus if I vote in the presidential primary?

Yes. Nothing prevents a person from voting in both the primary and the caucus. However, **ONLY** the caucus has an official role in selecting the Republican presidential candidate.

Why is there both a presidential primary and a caucus?

The Nevada Republican Party has chosen the caucus process to select the presidential nominee. In 2021 the Democratic-controlled legislature voted to hold primaries, regardless of the caucus plans of each party. It was signed into law by Democrat Governor Steve Sisolak. The Republican Primary results have **NO** impact on the race.

Can a person vote in the caucus even if they are a registered Republican in another state?

Yes. However, you must be a registered Republican in Nevada at least 30 days prior to the caucuses.

Where are the caucuses held?

Caucuses are held in many locations throughout the state.

The list of locations is on the CCRP web site at 2024 Caucus - CCRP (clarkcountyrepublicanparty.com). Voters from each precinct are assigned a specific caucus location.

How is a caucus different from a primary?

In a caucus, voters must meet in person, rather than voting by mail or by machines. Voters use paper

ballots. They also show photo ID. In a caucus, voters discuss their preferences and cast their private ballot to express their support for a candidate. The votes are publicly hand counted and the results announced the same day. Conversely, in primaries, voters use machines or mail. The results of the primary will be announced at some future date.

Can I speak for or against a candidate at the caucuses?

You may speak for or against any candidate. Many caucus meetings have very little discussion. The opportunity to speak is always available.

Which GOP presidential candidates are participating in the caucuses?

The candidates registered for the 2024 Nevada caucuses are: Ryan Binkley, Doug Burgum, Chris Christie, Ron DeSantis, Vivek Ramaswamy, and Donald Trump.

Do I need to be officially connected to a candidate for whom I express support? No.

Can I mail in my vote for a caucus?

Only active military and their immediate families may vote by mail.

Will my caucus vote be secret? Yes.

When will the results of the caucus be announced?

Results will be announced the same day.

Who pays for the Nevada GOP Caucus?

The caucuses are paid for by the participating presidential candidates who have already budgeted for such expenses.

Who pays for the presidential primary?

The primaries are paid for by taxpayers. The state has allocated \$5 million to run the primaries.

Does the Clark County Republican Party support a certain candidate for president at the caucuses? No.
