- 1. Attend the Clark County Convention on March 16 as a Delegate, OR
- 2. Attend two subsequent

CCRCC meetings and be voted in by the membership. These meetings are held every other month.



The Clark County Republican Convention will be held on March 16. Along with other business, delegates will be elected to represent the County at the Nevada Republican Convention.

The Nevada Republican Convention will be held in May. Along with other business, delegates will be elected to represent the State of Nevada at the National Republican Convention.

The National Republican Convention will be held on July 15-18 in Milwaukee, WI. Along with other business, delegates will elect the Republican Presidential Nominee for the November election. Each state (including Nevada) has rules on how delegates will be committed to vote for candidates.

Am I eligible to become a County Convention Delegate?

If you meet any of the following requirements, YES!

- 1. You participated in your Precinct Meeting at the Caucus and signed up to be a delegate;
- 2. You were a Caucus Volunteer, Precinct Captain, or Caucus Captain;
- 3. You are a Republican elected official or an announced candidate for public office;
- 4. You cast a ballot in the Presidential Preference Poll but did not remain for your precinct meeting. If you meet any of these conditions, congratulations! You are officially eligible to become a County Convention Delegate! Simply purchase your Convention ticket here.

Additionally, you may also be eligible to attend the Convention as a delegate if you made a goodfaith effort to attend your caucus but were unable to do so due to time constraints, weather conditions, or other exigent circumstances. If you were unable to participate for any of those reasons, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Purchase your Convention ticket here.
- 2. Please complete the following affidavit for review by the Convention Credentials Committee to confirm your eligibility: clarkcountyrepublicanparty.com/delegate

The Credentials Committee will review your affidavit, and if approved, will assign you temporary status as an "Alternate" Delegate at-large, allowing the body of the Convention to affirm your status as a full Delegate to the convention.

PLEASE NOTE! You must purchase your Convention ticket by March 13 to retain your Delegate status! Do not lose your opportunity to continue supporting Republicans! Once you have purchased your ticket, please keep an eye on your inbox for additional convention details, including information about the Platform, Agenda, and other business to be conducted at the convention, which will be sent in the coming weeks. We'll see you on March 16!
